BOARD 02 Using a Plant Tour in a Cost/Management Accounting Class to Reinforce Accounting Concepts

BOARD 21 The Impossible Interview: A Two-stage Interview Case for Auditing Students

Presenter: Veronica Paz, Indiana University of Pennsylvania; Janet L. Souza, The Pennsylvania State University Abington



Description: The case presented is aimed at students in their first auditing course as a way of introducing the need for more complex thinking and professional skepticism in the auditing and forensic accounting areas. The focus of the case is on risk assessment and critical evaluation of audit evidence, primarily audit interviews. In addition, the case allows students to learn the value of preparation and strategy in a unique way: their first attempt at the case is almost impossible to solve.

the use of logic games in undergraduate auditing courses to encourage critical thinking and problem solving as well as to increase student engagement. By using brief, non-accounting related logic games, we introduce these concepts to students in an everyday setting that allows them to continue their development outside the classroom. Survey responses and game results for 30 auditing and AIS students show that student game scores improve and students perceive the logic games help develop their critical thinking abilities. Overall, we believe the logic games are an effective and efficient tool that may be useful in other courses to encourage students to invest more fully into the development of reasoning skills.
