<u>Flipgrid</u> —A social learning platform that students enjoy! The **professor** makes videos and the students respond via videos they make.

We use this tool in online classes to allow students to **introduce** themselves to help *create connections*. We also use it for some course **discussion boards**, in lieu of a traditional written discussion. This helps *reinforce oral communication skills*.

<u>Kaltura</u> - We use **video quizzes** embedded in videos to ensure *student participation* and *comprehension*.



Zoom Breakout Rooms allow students to collaborate on

accounting problems.

Polling

Promotes student engagement and provides real time feedback to instructors.

Annotaate

Allows students (and instructors) to write on the screen for everyone on the session to see.

Student **chat leaders** help moderate live class sessions.
